

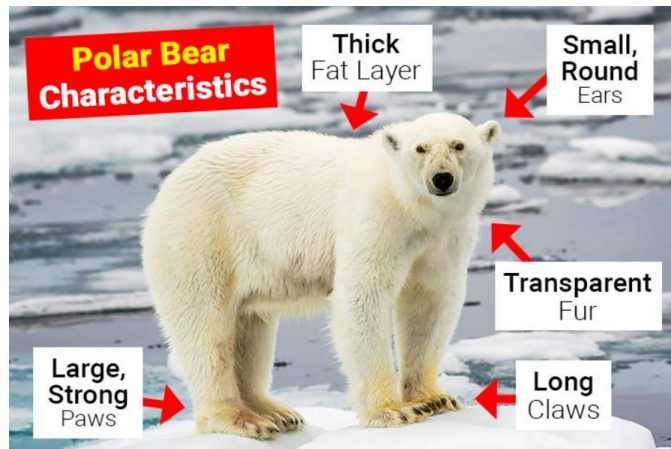


Year 2 | Geography | Spring 2 | Polar Bears



Key Learning

Polar Bears are found in the Arctic. This is in the Northern Hemisphere, in the top half of the world. The temperature falls so low in the winter that the sea freezes.



We will be able to:

- Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans, and identify that polar bears live in the Arctic, surrounded by the Arctic Ocean.
- Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying and contrasting the human and physical geography of the Arctic.
- Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to the human and physical geographical features of The Arctic.
- Recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.
- Use aerial photographs to recognise landmarks and human and physical features.

Polar Bears Vocabulary:

Globe: a model of the Earth.

Country: a land that is controlled by a single government.

Continent: a large area of land. Earth has 7 continents.

Aerial: related to the air, from above.

Map: drawing or model that helps you find where you are going.

Human Feature: made by people.

Physical Feature: naturally occurring.

Equator: an imaginary line that runs around the center of the Earth.
